Glossary of Terms

<u>nancial Aid</u>	All types of money offered to a student to help pay tuition, fees and other educational expenses. This can include loans, grants, scholarships, assistantships, fellowships and work study jobs.
Accredited	The goal of accreditation is to ensure that institutions of higher education meet acceptable levels of quality.
Transcript	Student's academic record that includes completed course work, grades, schools, GPA, Percentile, attendance, and is submitted as a part of the college application process with a school profile.
Community College	A public, two-year community colleges typically provide a transfer program, allowing students to transfer to a four-year school to complete their bachelor's degree, and a career program, which provides students with a vocational degree.
Advanced Academics	Classes such as AP, IB, Cambridge, CTE, or Dual Enrollment where you earn weight in your GPA and have the potential to earn college credit. Search the college registrars website for transfer credit standards.


